<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we will continue to work on our understanding of written methods for the four main operations and then we will

move on to develop our understanding of shape, space and measures before some Christmas themed data handling!

Year 1s need to continue to practise counting backwards and counting forwards in steps of 2, 5 and 10. Year 2s need to continue to develop their confidence and speed recall of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. This half term our theme is 'Beat, Band, Boogie'. As the title suggests a lot of our learning will be around music and sound.



Within our English lessons, we will make links with the theme to support our writing of instructions, newspaper reports, narratives, lyrics and invitations.

In our music lessons we will be focusing heavily on the difference between rhythm and pulse and learning to clap in time to a beat. We will also be learning about different instruments and choosing appropriate instruments for different purposes. We will also be listening to a variety of different genres and sharing our ideas and opinions with each other about what we have heard.

In science, we will be learning about the sense of hearing and thinking about the different sounds in our environment. We will also do some different investigations to answer questions such as 'How does the amount of water in a glass affect its sound?'

In our art & design technology sessions we will be using a variety of materials to make instruments of our own and investigate how we can make music with everyday items.

Also, during our Dance (P.E.) lessons we will be practising to march in time with a beat and begin to think about body percussion!
