<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we begin by looking at multiplication and division and different methods we can use to solve these. We then move onto fractions and working out what a half and a quarter is of different shapes, amounts and numbers. We will be using this knowledge to apply this to everyday life. Finally we will look at some measurement focusing on money and length. During our money learning we will be looking at what coins and notes we have and how we can make totals.

This half term our theme is 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers'. We will be finding out lots about different animals from domestic pets to wild animals.

Within our English lessons, we begin by writing our own animal stories based on the 'Just So Stories' of how animals got certain features e.g. How the elephant got his trunk. We will be then writing information booklets about how to look after a tiger basing this on the story 'The Tiger that came to Tea.' Finishing off the half term writing instructions based on how to look after an animal and be a zoo keeper.

In our Science lessons we will be looking at different features of animals and humans and why they are needed, food chains and what animals need in order to survive both in the wild and in a zoo.

In Geography we will be looking at maps and globes, learning where different animals come from and creating our own zoo map based on the knowledge we have of animals.


In our Art & Design technology sessions we will be making an enclosure for an animal based on its needs and sketching and drawing animals based on an artist while adding in detail using different techniques.

Indoor PE this half term is gymnastics. We will be thinking about how different animals move and putting these together to create routines using different heights and levels.

Outdoor PE will continue to be multi skills working on our skills of throwing, catching, aiming and teamwork through skill based games.
