<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we will be focusing on multiplication and division (using concrete and abstract ideas to practise these skills). Year 3 children will also carry on with their addition and subtraction unit, whilst year 4 children will move on to length and perimeter. Children will work on a variety of fluency skills in order to revisit and ensure understanding, whilst also looking at new ways we can show strategies. They will also have the chance to attempt reasoning questions, in which they explain their method and answers, and problem-solving questions, in which they can work methodically to reach an answer using a range of skills.

This half term our theme is 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles.' This theme predominately focuses on geography, however it has links throughout the curriculum.

In our geography lessons we will be exploring the various rock types, and influential people of history who shaped the way we look at the world.

Our lessons around volcanoes will give an insight into activity through the layers of our Earth, and the ways in which this is monitored.

Alongside this, our science will focus on soil types and testing these, while our DT will involve making working volcanoes.

English

In English, we will be writing an information text all about volcanoes and earthquakes. We will be looking at the features of an information text and finding out how volcanoes and earthquakes are formed. We will complete our learning by creating a double page layout, which will incorporate all of the features we have learnt, as well as the knowledge we have discovered.

We will be also learning the essential skills of how to write and structure a letter. We will be writing from the perspective of being in a vicinity of erupting volcano and sharing the events and our feelings with a loved one.
