

In English, we will begin by welcoming two visitors to our class, Mr Williams and his 5 month old son and Mrs Davies. This half term our theme is

'Time Traveller'

Time stops for no one - not even us!

This half term, we'll meet people from different generations to find out what life was like in the past and we'll predict how things might change in the future. Using real portraits from the past for inspiration, we'll write character descriptions about the people in them. Our science work will focus on puberty and why hygiene is important. We'll also create clock artwork based on the style of Salvador Dali.

In art we will use a digital camera to take a close-up photograph of a partner's face. We will then create sketches, before experimenting with different mediums to produce a portrait. We will also look at images of different types of clocks and clock faces and explore Salvador Dali's use of clock imagery in his artwork. Design and paint a unique clock and clock face, taking inspiration from images and artefacts.
