As the sun is still shining, please ensure your child comes to school with a sun hat and water bottle to hydrate throughout the day.


Please continue to support your child at home by reading daily, practising times tables, and completing any home learning set each week.


Maths

This half term, we will be focusing on place value (the value of digits, different representations of number, and Roman numerals) and addition and



This half term our theme is 'Urban Pioneers.' This theme focuses on geography, computing, art and science but has links throughout the curriculum.

In our **geography** lessons we will be using our **computing** skills to access digital maps to investigate the local area.



We will also be using **computing** skills in **art** where we will be using digital photography of urban landscapes. Additionally, in **art** we will be looking at the works of famous urban artists, such as Banksy, discussing our thoughts on their work and creating our own art pieces.

Alongside this in **science**, we will be learning about light and shadows, specifically how shadows are produced when light is blocked and how light helps us see.

English

In English, we are learning about diaries. We are reading the story, 'Katie's Picture Show'. Katie visits an art gallery where she gets into mischief by jumping into the pictures. We will look at the features of a diary and diary examples, before writing our own about Katie's day.

Next, we will be looking at fantasy stories, reading lots of examples and talking about the ones we enjoy the most and then writing our own fantasy story.

We will finish the half term by writing our own poetry.
