<u>Maths</u>

This half term, we will be looking at weight using scales to measure grams and kilograms. We will also be exploring

statistics, posing questions, collecting data and creating graphs. From these graphs we will be answering questions and finding out information. After this we will be looking at capacity, using the measurements litres and millilitres and temperature using the measurements degrees Celsius.



In English this half term, we will be writing our own poetry based on the poem 'Ladybird Ladybird What Do You See' and writing leaflets based on bee keeping. We will also be using the story of 'The Hungry Caterpillar' to create our own stories.

In our Geography lessons, we will be doing lots of fieldwork in the school grounds to observe and study what we having living around us. We will also be looking at human and physical features in our environment.

In computing we will be creating and debugging programs and understanding algorithms.

In Science we will be looking at mini beasts, their habitats and how they are best suited to that habitat. We will look at basic human and animal needs and why it is important that we receive all of them.

In our Art & Design technology sessions we will be sketching mini beasts looking at developing our techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape and form.

Indoor PE this half term is dance. We will be looking at different movements based on those you may see mini beasts do.

In outdoor PE will be developing our skills of throwing and catching by introducing kwick fires three cricket. The children will get to practise their throwing, catching and hitting skills in a real life game situation.
